

Upper Garments:

Road to Success Alternative Program

The mission of the Franklin Township Alternative Program is to prepare enrolled students to graduate high school and be college and or career ready, by providing individualized course studies, social and emotional learning, counseling services, and a supportive school atmosphere.

- We service students in **grades 7-12 from in/out of district**.
- The RTS school day is 12:30 PM-6:00 PM.
- Lunch is provided to all students.
- This year, RTS students will report to Franklin Youth Center from 12:30pm to
 2:30pm and then be bussed to FMS HSC from 2:40pm to 6:00pm for classes.

- At RTS, all students are encouraged to improve themselves academically, behaviorally, and attendance wise. **Restorative Justice Practices** will be used by RTS staff to support student achievement.
- Students take core subjects, as well as Media Arts & World Language courses at the Middle School level.
- Students take core subjects, as well as varied electives offered at the High School level (Drone Technology, Ceramics, Sports & Fashion Management, Pathways to Success etc.).
- Class sizes are limited to 10 students maximum for middle schoolers (12 max for HS).
- RTS middle and high school students are **separated** for all academic and elective classes.
- Partnership with the Franklin Youth Center this year, RTS students will be able to take courses in Drone
 Technology, TV Production, & Culinary Arts.
- Transportation is provided for all RTS students to and from school.
- Partnership with Raritan Valley Community College & Middlesex Community College this year for concurrent enrollment career pathways courses and other career driven programs.
- RTS students will attend college tours, be exposed to local businesses and career opportunities.
