The Franklin Township Public School Alternative Education Program has been created to better meet the needs of students in grades 7-12 who have been unsuccessful in the regular education program.

The goal of the alternative education program is to support all students to graduate high school and be college and/ or career-ready.

The alternative program will provide options for students not reaching their potential in the conventional educational setting. The alternative program is intended to lead students toward success in education through the use of innovative teaching techniques, greater access to counseling services, more individualized course study, flexible scheduling, lower student/teacher ratios and a more supportive and encouraging classroom atmosphere that will be infused with technology.

"All students can learn, just not in the same way or on the same day"

Entrance/Exit Criteria:

Recommendations from Principals, School Counselors, parents, students and Child Study Team members will be accepted. Students may be referred for the following reasons:

- Student is not age appropriate for the grade level
- Student requires more support services than the district can provide in the regular school program
- Student has a history of academic failure in core subject areas
- Student demonstrates patterns of school avoidance behaviors
- Student demonstrated disregard of the district's Code of Conduct

Transition Program:

The Alternative School Counselor will write a transition plan a student before they are reinstated back to the larger schools. A grade-level administrator will conduct a weekly review of how the student is doing.






- 1 .Students must demonstrate mastery of material at a 67%.
