III. Interim Superintendent's Report

Before I report out on the many activities of the district, I would like to take a few moments to share my first impressions of our district realizing that I probably will omit one or more things that are so impressive about Franklin. I am truly impressed with my colleagues. Whether they are support staff, teachers, administrators, or board members, they are all dedicated to providing the best, most appropriate education possible for all our students...and all means all. The way the district has taken on the challenges of public education in 2013-2014, PARCC, State Testing programs, SGO's, SGP's, technology, new teacher evaluation model that includes for the first time student achievement, is outstanding.

While the challenges are great, our teachers, administrators, support staff, have addressed these head on and are making great progress in revolutionizing how we educate our students. While I realize that we are not perfect and there are many challenges ahead, I am confident that by working collaboratively and using data, knowledge and experience to drive our decision-making process, we will meet those challenges and find opportunities to grow as educators and as a district.

Finally, I would be remiss if I failed to mention our students and their parents and guardians. While my interaction with them has been limited up to this point, what I've seen and heard are students wanting to learn and parents and guardians supporting their children and our teachers. This kind of effort and support is key to improving our schools and increasing the achievement of our students whether it is in the classroom, on our athletic fields or on the stage. I hope to open channels of communications to build on this support and, again, working together to improve our schools and district to better meet the needs of all students.

Now, to the Superintendent's Report...

Administrative Professionals Week

We would like to take this opportunity to recognize and commend our administrative professionals. As we often comment, our administrative assistants play a vital and crucial role in insuring that our schools are operating effectively and efficiently and we thank them for their dedication to our students, staff and community.

QSAC Update

Earlier today our district was visited by Dr. Beverly Hetrick, Education Program Development Specialist, Somerset County, and Dr. Gerald J. Vernotica, Interim Executive County Superintendent, Hunterdon County. This marked the second visit of this cycle of the Quality Single Accountability Continuum - (QSAC) review process. This is an obligation that all school districts are required to complete every three years. While unofficial at this time, the feedback that we received was predominantly positive, especially with regard to our curriculum, assessments and use of Rubicon. Dr. Hetrick and Dr. Vernotica were able to speak to several members of our teaching staff today. Dr. Hetrick will return in a few weeks to tour some of our classrooms before a final report is issued. At that time we will share the results with the board and public.

Referendum Update

At the board meeting on March 27, 2014 the Board of Education approved September 30, 2014 as the date to hold a special election for the referendum for a new school and additions/renovations to our existing schools. More information about the referendum proposal, which is also known as One Less Move, is available on the district website.

We are pleased to report that the district has been successful in obtaining monies towards specific projects within the referendum proposal which will help to defray the cost to the average taxpayer. To date we have received grant approvals for \$3.9 million dollars and an additional \$897,000 in debt service aid. We still await word from the Department of Education on nine other projects within the referendum which were also submitted for debt service aid.

Pre-School Program

The district will once again be able to offer a pre-school program for Franklin Township residents who will be 4 years old on or before October 31, 2014. Applications for this program are available online. The application drop-off dates are next Wednesday, April 30th and Thursday, May 1st from 4-7 PM and Friday, May 2nd and Monday, May 5th from 9:00 AM – noon at the board office. More information on the application process is available on the district website.

In the Schools

We are pleased to report that all students taking the NJ ASK examinations over the next few weeks will be offered free breakfast on their testing days.

Comments on Agenda Items

<u>Policy Issue</u> - A proposed revision to Policy 6173 Home Instruction appears on tonight's agenda for a first reading. This revision would allow the district to provide Home Instruction to our secondary level students via a virtual education course/online provider. We have been experiencing difficulty securing teachers with the proper certification to provide home instruction for our middle and high school students. The use of an online provider will help to ease that difficulty and efficiently provide the required home instruction.

Grant Writing Service

I am pleased to note that there is also a memorandum of agreement on tonight's agenda for grant writing services which will allow the district to pursue funding in a cost-effective manner. The memorandum of agreement provides that the company will receive a percentage of the monies received in successfully funded grants. No district funds will be spent on unsuccessful grant applications. Approval is pending based on the grant writer receiving State approval. He is currently going through the approval process.

Personnel Matters

We are continuing our search for an Interim Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction and have readvertised the position and reposted the position on professional websites seeking additional candidates. Additionally, we are re-advertising for the position of Director of Assessment and Accountability.

Tonight the board is asked to approve a recommendation for the award of a contract to Source4Teachers for substitute teacher staffing services for the 2014-2015 school year. They have made a brief presentation this evening. Their proposal was also recently presented to both the Personnel and Finance Committees. Our current substitute teachers were invited to a meeting where they were provided with details of the potential transition and given the opportunity to ask questions. Should the board approve the recommendation this evening, we will proceed with Option A as outlined in our preliminary budget presentation. The public hearing on the budget will be held on May 6, 2014.

IV. Board President's Report

Moment of Silence

I ask that we take this opportunity to remember June Van Dyke, who passed away last Friday. June served as a secretary in our district for almost 49 years, most recently in our Personnel Department. She had the distinction of having the longest record of service in our district, having worked in several different areas and under various Superintendents. Her obituary notes that "she lived a full life with a youthful spirit, touching the heart and soul of those she met." The Board of Education and the Franklin Township Public School family recognizes June's many years of service and our prayers go out to her family in their time of loss.

Public School Volunteer Week

I would like to take this opportunity to thank, on behalf of the Board and the Administration, all of those parents/guardians and other community members who volunteer their time and talents to help the students of our district. Your contributions really make a difference in the lives of our children.

Summer Reading Program

Books in the Park is a summer reading program that encourages students in Franklin Township to keep up with their reading during the summer break. During the month of July, teachers and student volunteers from Franklin High School visit areas in town to share stories and crafts with the community children. Children are allowed to borrow books to take home. Partially funded by a grant, the program also relies on donations from businesses and individuals from the community. To support this program we have set up a donation box at the administration office and here at our regular board meetings. Please drop off any new or gently used children/young adult books or arts and craft materials, and we will ensure that the program receives the materials this summer.
