After each board member named their top three choices (Eva Nagy had only two), the candidate with the most votes was Alex Kharazi, followed by a tie for second place for John Kinghorn and Edward Potosnak.

Dr. Presley requested a show of hands to choose the second place candidate between Edward Potosnak and John Kinghorn. Edward Potosnak received 5 votes (*Arline, Burton, Danielsen, LaCorte, Presley*) and John Kinghorn received 2 votes (*Nagy, Whalen*), making Edward Potosnak the candidate to run against Alex Kharazi.

At this point, Dr. Presley requested a show of hands for a vote for either Alex Kharazi or Edward Potosnak to serve as a board member. Mr. Calavano reminded the board that the successful candidate must receive 5 votes. Alex Kharazi received 3 votes (Nagy, Presley, Whalen) and Edward Potosnak received 4 votes (Arline, Burton, Danielsen, LaCorte).

Each board member commented on the candidate of their choice. Dr. Presley requested another show of hands for Edward Potosnak, who received the same 4 votes.

Board President, Dr. Presley, complimented Dr. Kharazi on his background and changed her vote to Edward Potosnak, allowing him the 5 votes needed to become the new board member.
