The meeting was opened for public comment at 8:00 PM on a motion by Mrs. Nagy, seconded by Mrs. Whalen. All board members were in agreement. Public comments were heard by the Board of Education. The following is a brief synopsis of comments made by the public.

John Felix congratulated Ms. Pagán on her appointment and requested to know why Eva Nagy voted no on this appointment.

Motion to close the public portion of the meeting at 8:06 PM by Mrs. Whalen, seconded by Mrs. Nagy. All board members were in agreement.

### **Board Discussion:**

The board discussed the Interim Superintendent search process and the proposed privatization of paraprofessionals and substitute teachers.

Motion to take a 5-minute recess at 10:13 PM by Mrs. Danielsen, seconded by Mrs. LaCorte. All board members were in agreement.

The meeting was opened for public comment at 10:19 PM on a motion by Mr. Trautmann, seconded by Mrs. Nagy. All board members were in agreement. Public comments were heard by the Board of Education. The following is a brief synopsis of comments made by the public.

Laurel Kane indicated she has been employed in the school district for 17 years and has to have benefits. She asked the board not to privatize the paraprofessionals.

Sami Ishaq, 6<sup>th</sup> grader at Sampson G. Smith School, read a statement about his paraprofessional and asked the board to save the paraprofessionals.

Natasha Ishaq, 7<sup>th</sup> grader at Franklin Middle School, spoke about why she is here today and spoke in support of Anna Boardman.

Another student asked to keep all the skilled paraprofessionals.

Jennifer Boardman, a senior at Franklin High School, spoke in support of substitute teachers.

Upendra Chivukula, spoke in support of paraprofessionals and asked that other possibilities be explored.

Anna Boardman spoke about her students and stated that she works an average of 9 hours per day. She spoke against privatization of the paraprofessionals.

Janice Regan indicated that substitute teaching leads to teaching jobs and suggested that an outside agency look at our budget. Ms. Regan requested that administration look over the budget again and be creative and to trim back administrative salaries.

Paula Jara expressed her hope that the board does not vote to privatize the paraprofessionals.

Another member of the public indicated that people's jobs are on the line, that students need consistency and to find other ways to save money.

Kathleen Damore spoke about paraprofessionals being the most dedicated people you will meet and requested to know why the board is exploring this again.

Emily Amon spoke in support of the dedicated paraprofessionals and questioned how the students will be impacted.

Karen Melhorn pointed out that the paraprofessionals already took a pay cut and a reduction of benefits.

Another member of the public expressed concern with the pay structure at Hunterdon County Ed Services Commission and that the budget is not on the website.

A paraprofessional from Franklin Park School spoke about current paraprofessionals and asked the board not to privatize them. She does not want to lose her job and indicated most of the current paraprofessionals will not work with Hunterdon County Ed Services Commission.

A district teacher requested that the board consider what is best for the students.

Nancy Llanos spoke positively about the paraprofessionals and that her son benefited from a paraprofessional. She pointed out that not everyone can do this job.

Maddy Michaylin has been an employee for the past 10 years and invited the Board of Education members into her classroom. She suggested alternate ways for getting revenues and emphasized that the paraprofessionals are valuable.

Debra Abramo indicated that you cannot put a price on the paraprofessionals and urged the board members to support her just as she supported them.

Monica Espinoza spoke about the training she received as a paraprofessional and is afraid of who will replace her.

Tamara Johnson indicated she is a one-on-one aide for an autistic student and pointed out that paraprofessionals are critical. If the board decides to privatize, they are firing 123 paraprofessionals.

Matilda Vajtay asked the board to consider spending an hour in a special education classroom and pointed out that "we voted you in". She restated the district's Mission Statement.

Dan Epstein spoke about the diversity in the district and that actions have consequences.

Susan Lenczewski paid tribute and honored MacAfee's educational support staff that has a total of 132 years of service.

Michelle Croll believes the board cares more about numbers than them. She spoke about unemployment benefits, out-of-district placements and litigation.

Carol Croll spoke about special needs students and pointed out that most paraprofessionals are community members. She pointed out that "your child is every child".

Joseph Adriano asked the board not to privatize the paraprofessionals.

Anthony Greder asked the board not to put a dollar sign on people.

Janet Grosso spoke about being a paraprofessional and that privatizing them is a disservice to dedicated and loyal employees.

Virginia McDonald spoke about her career as a paraprofessional.

Patricia Martinelli, teacher, indicated she cannot teach her students without her paraprofessionals.

Pam Wewers spoke about being a paraprofessional.

Chris Boardman spoke about his mother's work as a paraprofessional and finished Anna Boardman's statement.

Patrick Froin expressed his anger over privatization.

Barbary Mikytuck stated that someone making an hourly wage will not do this job and that students will have a different aide every day.

Fern Shegoski indicated she was not aware of the privatization of substitutes and feels they are not respected. There is a major trust issue with the board.

Jackie Yanchuk spoke about being a paraprofessional and her qualifications. She asked why the board targets paraprofessionals every year and they will get what they pay for.

Mary Murdock stated that her niece works for Hunterdon County Ed Services Commission and receives no benefits, with salaries between \$15.55 – 22.43 per hour.

Lorri Mountainland thanked her members for coming out to support the paraprofessionals, asked the board to abandon privatization and pointed out there is a contractual obligation not to privatize.

Paul Walczyk surveyed the paraprofessionals and reported the results.

Ardaman Singh believes that privatizing the paraprofessionals to close the budget gap is a bad idea and it will adversely impact the learning community.

Linda Powell spoke against privatization and about budget options developed three years ago from a small group of people. She spoke about district turnover.

Angela Barkley believes privatizing the paraprofessionals and substitutes is a bad idea and that privatizing will weaken the school and community relationship.

Wendell Steinhauer, President of the New Jersey Education Association, thanked the board for their services. He indicated that paraprofessionals cannot be devalued anymore.

Stephanie Gonzalez indicated that she was devastated when the district removed the kindergarten paraprofessionals years ago. She asked the board not to outsource the paraprofessionals and take away their livelihood.

Karen Ellis asked the board to please listen to what was said tonight.

Motion to close the public portion of the meeting at 12:15 PM by Mrs. Nagy, seconded by Mrs. Whalen. All board members were in agreement.
