The Committee was given an update on the One Less Move Referendum implementation. The chairpersons of the transition subcommittees have been designated. Their names will come to the Board for approval at the March 22, 2016 meeting. District administrators have been made aware of the subcommittees and asked to join one or two which correspond to their interests. Following Board approval of the subcommittees, an all staff email will be sent asking those who have an interest in serving on a subcommittee, to contact administration. There will be a larger meeting of these subcommittees on May 11, 2016 in the Franklin High School cafeteria.

The Committee was updated on recent press coverage and on recent community events such as the special performance of the Lion King, Jr. at Sampson G. Smith School for our adult community members and senior citizens. Invitations to the Franklin High School Art Show were also extended to these groups.

Upcoming events include the Teacher/Educational Support Professional of the Year Breakfast on May 13, 2016 and a Realtor Bruch at Franklin High School on May 18, 2016. Upcoming Board presentations include a student recognition and budget presentation at the March 22, 2016 meeting.

The committee was updated on the district's communication regarding our preschool application process. This included informational sessions which were held at each of the elementary schools as well as an evening session at Sampson G. Smith School.
